Committee Reports:

Treasury: See attached report.

There was \$80 was collected for the Jamming into Recovery event.

OAsis: MaryAnn reported several articles have been submitted and the spring OAsis will be available on March 21, 2021. Information on past events and updates on upcoming events will be included. Susan thanked MaryAnn and suggested sharing OAsis with one or two friends.

Info Line: Clare reported she returned five calls that came into the information line. The information line number is 973-746-8787. Clare also reported Google contacted the hotline to get information on OA. Bonnie said it is a sales call, ignore it.

Events: Bonnie said the events calendar is updated. The Jamming into Recovery went really well. She thanked the Zoom committee for opening the meeting up to more than 100 participants. Flyers are being worked on for Am I Worth It, and My Body and Me and will be in the mid-month packet. Bonnie thanked Susan for all her help and ToniAnn for running the Summer Series.

Website: Bonnie reported the website is running fine and going smoothly. She thanked Mary and Barbara for their hard work. Susan thanked Bonnie for all her help.

Public Information: Maria said Laura was helping post ads in the NJ Patch, which finally responded to our request to post information. The committee is doing what they can to reach out to nutritionists, dieticians, and social workers in the area. Kristy sent out 30 e-mails to churches. Marcy has been sending out flyers to libraries, hospitals. Maria feels traction as calls are coming into the information phone line. Flyers are available for download on the NJIOA website for local distribution. A few newcomer packets were sent out by Shari. The tools pamphlet is available as a PDF.
